University Teaching Learning Community

Group/Badge Description:

This group is designed for individuals who are interested in both developing as a scientist who would teach in a university setting and for those who are interested in teaching-focused careers. This group will meet regularly – about every three or four weeks. This group will have three general types of meetings:

- Skills sessions, focusing on the nuts and bolts of teaching and learning in a university setting. This includes
 creating a syllabus, planning a lecture/lesson, advising students, planning a curriculum, and more.
 Participants will suggest what sessions they would like during our first/organizational meeting
- Conversations and networking with faculty at central Indiana universities, providing you opportunities to get advice and to hear about teaching opportunities in the area for both now and later
- A journal-club format where we will study the literature related to teaching and learning in the life sciences. Assignments will be selected by members after the first meeting.

Student/Scholar Learning Outcomes

At the completion of this learning community, students/postdocs will be able to:

- 1. Analyze research literature related to the scholarship of teaching and learning in the biological/life sciences
- 2. Lead quality discussions of the literature related to biomedical science education at the university level.
- 3. Demonstrate improved knowledge and skills related to teaching and learning through UTLC sessions led, discussions, and through a UTLC individual project
- 4. Create a learning experience or curricular materials designed to help others learn a specific topic with minimal assistance.

Required tasks for this microcredential will be:

- Attend and participate in at least 10 of 13 sessions of the UTLC throughout the academic year
- Present a research paper on a topic related to biomedical/biological science education to the UTLC, leading a discussion of the paper and presenting on key elements and findings of the paper
- Complete an individualized project, customized to the student/postdoc and in consultation with the UTLC facilitator, in which the student/postdoc creates a course/workshop/webinar design or designs another learning experience.
- Complete a meeting with a Graduate Division team member to discuss your current career goals and the individualized project
